School Photography Guidelines for Parents and Carers

Information for Parents and Carers

We recognise that parents and carers enjoy photographing and recording the progress of their child at school and on school activities. We recognise that many of you like to share these personal memories online and on social media.

We ask for your cooperation and care concerning the use and distribution of photographs of other children at our school. Some families have very real legal and safety issues which could put a child at risk if an image is made public online. More generally, it is respectful of the privacy of other members of the school community to ask permission before posting an image online. Even if your social media settings are private, it is easy for images to become public, particularly if they are tagged or shared by others.

Best practice guidelines

The following best practice guidelines have been adopted by our school to keep our students and school community safe, and to ensure respectful practices concerning the use of social media. When taking photographs or recordings at school or at school events and your images include other I dentifiable persons please follow these guidelines:

- Crop out other students or seek the permission of the student or (for students under 16) his or her parent/carer before posting online.
- Do not tag or name the person without permission.
- If a parent or carer requests that you do not circulate an image of their child to others, please comply with the request.
- Please seek the permission of our staff to photograph or record their activities at school.
 Photography of staff presenting or receiving awards is permitted.

The school will periodically review these best practice guidelines.

Mandatory policies:

The school may from time to time determine that photography or recording at school events or on school grounds is restricted. Where restriction is notified, failure to comply may result in your exclusion from school premises or activities. There may also be consequences as set out in the enrolment agreement.

Under no circumstances may you photograph or record in private areas such as change-rooms, or in school offices or staffrooms, or at meetings, without express permission.

From the Acting AP

Teachers are often asked by parents how they can help their children with writing. Here are some small things that make a big difference to your child as they learn to become a writer.

READ! Read often. Read aloud. Read silently. Read books. Read short stories. Read poems. Read cookbooks. Read letters. Read greeting cards.

Get the idea? Read, read, and read some more!

PROVIDE WRITING MATERIALS! Provide plenty of writing materials – paper of all kinds, colours, textures, and sizes, pens, pencils, felt tip pens, post its – whatever will invite your student writer to explore writing in original, colorful ways.

WRITE NOTES! A personal note – just a few words – tucked in a lunch box or left under a pillow can be a wonderful surprise. If you're lucky, you'll get a response. Writing doesn't always have to be BIG.

READERS' THEATER! Read a play or any book that lends itself to two voices. Your young writer will soon have an "ear" for sentence fluency.

RESOURCES! Have a dictionary handy! A thesaurus? Grammar handbook? It not, shop together for books both of you like. Use them with care. For example, when you use a thesaurus, don't take the first word on the list. Choose the word that's just right!

BROWSE! Discover the fine art of browsing at the local bookstore or the library. Look at books, handle books, read pieces from books. What is it about this book that intrigues you? An opening sentence? The layout? The title?

BE A WRITER YOURSELF! You don't have to be writing a novel to teach valuable writing strategies – a simple grocery list hold a dozen potential lessons on word choice, organisation, and spelling.

SHARE! Do you write as part of your job? Letters? Memos? Reports? Evaluations? Advertising or promotional materials? Directions? Almost everyone in every occupation writes something. Share some of your work related writing with your student writer.

A lovely quote I came across on a writing blog sums up the importance of letting children be children and exploring and experiencing life;

"Writers can't just write about life, they have to live it, too."


YEAR 5 CULTURAL EXPO


It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

Our Lord loved to unfurl the scroll of the Prophet Isaiah in his local synagogue.

The poetic image of **swords being hammered into ploughshares** reverberated into his renouncing
violence against the Roman occupying army in his own
time. When will this picture come true for all human beings
for all time?

Only God knows! We don't know any more than we know when a burglar might target our home. But **our ignorance of God's timetable is no excuse for being fatalistic and sleepy**. We have our own span of life providing the timetable for our own contribution to the hammering of swords into ploughshares.



Recent Popes, especially St John Paul II, have taken up this theme for our times, teaching more restrictive criteria for using armed force, even dropping the term 'just war' to very small print in the Catechism.

We could pause for a moment to pray to be awake to our opportunities to shape society in the light of the vision of Isaiah and the practice of Jesus the Prince of Peace.

We have prepared an Advent Prayer Celebration to remind us of the opportunity of Advent as a time of preparation for the coming of Christ. \cdot All children are involved in the prayer in some small



way. Most importantly it is a time to come together to hear the Word of God, to give praise and thanks and to again place our trust and hope in the Lord as we renew our efforts in doing His will.

One of the **major symbols of the Advent season is the wreath.** The encircling wreath is symbolic of God without beginning or end and the green foliage represents our hope in God. There are usually five candles in the wreath, a central white candle representing the light of Christ that came into the world and then four outside candles that are usually purple and rose coloured. The first candle is generally symbolic of Hope and Expectation. The third candle – the rose or pink candle – celebrates the Joy that is anticipated in the coming of Christ. The progressive lighting of the candles marks the journey towards the Nativity.

2017 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials

Any Primary students enrolled in Parramatta Diocesan Schools in Year 5 and 6 in 2017 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term One/Two in 2017 (Winter Sports - AFL, Football, Hockey, Netball, Rugby League League, Rugby Union & Touch).

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2017 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials in 2017 will be held in the following sports:

*AFL (boys), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G),
Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website

www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au. This online form is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST for the 2017 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and MUST be approved by your child's school. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience".

Please ensure that the SUBMIT button has been pressed upon completing the form and notification email will be sent to the parent/guardian listed on the form confirming this expression of interest has been received.

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information theat

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

Winter Sports Registrations close Friday 3rd February 5pm.
