PENTECOST LITURGY LED BY YEAR FIVE

On Sunday we celebrated Pentecost Sunday as part of the Church liturgical year. You might be aware of the T.V. program, "Extreme Makeover", in which people are given the opportunity to undergo cosmetic surgery to help them to "look better". This "makeover" process promises to make people happy and to feel better about themselves. Millions of people world-wide undergo cosmetic surgery, botox injections as well as decorative tattooing and body piercing to make themselves look special, more appealing, more "unique".



Many people seem to be not satisfied with themselves the way they are. They want a "change for the better" and these procedures offer change, "happiness" and above all transformation. Of course, appearance is important but it is not what life is all about.

Two thousand years ago a small group of Jewish people was very much wondering what life was all about. They were hiding in a small house, anxious, perplexed and in fear of their own lives. Their leader, who had been their inspiration, had been executed, had come back to them in a mysterious resurrected form and then, had ascended into the clouds before their very eyes. Their lives were in turmoil. Things had been going so well for the past three years and now disaster. And what were they to make of Jesus' words to them, "I am going to the Father but I will send you the Holy Spirit"?

Little did the Apostles realise they were about to have their very own "Extreme Makeover." When the Spirit did come to them, they heard the sound of a rushing

wind and saw tongues of fire above each other's head; but what they felt was a total internal transformation. From their mouths came words they had never heard before and understanding that came from a source beyond their means. They were filled with joy, their fear was gone, all negativity had vanished and they were completely unconcerned about themselves. They were flabbergasted but totally inspired. They left their hiding place and relished the crowds that came to them;



by the end of the day, they had baptised three thousand people. They had become other Christs in the world and would continue to do His work till, like Him, most were executed.

Confirmation is a Sacrament of process, of change and growth; it is kept moving by the way we call on the gifts of the Spirit to help us to overcome the negative influences that daily enter into our lives.

SWEET DREAMS

At Our Lady of the Rosary we endeavour to ensure that each child reaches their full potential in their learning by exploring their unique gifts and talents. In order to reach these goals it is vital that students eat well, exercise and have adequate sleep.

The quality of our sleep directly affects the quality of our waking life, including our mental sharpness, productivity, emotional balance, creativity, physical vitality, and even our weight. Some children do not appear to get enough sleep each night. Adolescents require between 8.25 and 9.25 hours of sleep per night.



Sleep isn't exactly a time when our body and brain shut off. While we rest, our brain stays busy, overseeing a wide variety of biological maintenance that keeps our body running in top condition, preparing us for the day ahead. Without enough hours of restorative sleep, we won't be able to work, learn, create, and communicate at a level even close to our true potential.

According to Dr Michael Carr-Gregg, one of Australia's leading adolescent psychologist, "A good night's sleep is the best study tool." It is so important for parents to ensure that their children have a good sleeping environment. Good sleep hygiene is essential. Bedrooms should be dark, cool and quiet to enable good quality sleep. No technology (particularly mobile phones and laptops) should be kept in bedrooms at night as these offer far too many distractions and interruptions. Diet also plays an important role – sugary sweets and coffee should never be consumed before going to bed. Sweet Dreams!

Technology at OLR

At OLR Technology is incorporated into the Learning for students every day. Students use Technology to access their learning, enhance their learning and think creatively.

We are fortunate to have 1:1 Chromebooks in Years 3-6 allowing each child to have access to a Chromebook in their classroom every day. In K-2 the students have ipads to learn the beginning skills of how technology can enhance learning.



We have recently purchased new Chromes to extend them into year 2 and replace any in Years 3-6 that need to be updated.



As well as using technology for everyday tasks in the classroom our dents are learning about coding.

We have access to resources such as Spheros, Bluebots and robotics.



Every Monday at lunchtime the students can go to 'Technology Club' to learn more about coding and play and explore with the technology to develop their skills. They have been using an App called 'Scratch' to code the Spheros to perform certain tasks.

The students can also access **READING AND RESEARCH** via the elibrary. Students can borrow books, including audio books to enjoy both at home and at school.

All students in K-2 have access to the PM Readers to practice their reading at home. All students can access the CEDP elibrary.


